WELCOME TO THE 13TH ANNUAL COASTLINE CHILDREN'S FILM FESTIVAL

Thirteen years ago we were inspired by the 8½ FOUNDATION. Founded by Tilda Swinton and Mark Cousins, its mission is to make great films available to young people everywhere:

"And we have noticed over the many hundred cinema journeys we have taken that our most memorable may be made many decades ago, may be made without color, may be with subtitles or not a single spoken word."

That idea became our mandate; our manifesto. For 10 days, we invite you to enjoy a selection of full-length features, documentaries, short films and classic silent films all for FREE.

The festival kicks off **FRIDAY**, **MARCH 3** with an **OPENING NIGHT COSTUME PARTY** at the Krasl Art Center. Come as your favorite animated character and you could win a prize for the most creative costume. Festivities begin at 6pm with popcorn, cupcakes from Bit of Swiss and a music program featuring the First Grade Choir from Watervliet South Elementary led by **BRANDON MATTSON**. **KID FLICKS ONE**, a selection of shorts from the New York International Children's Film Festival (NYICFF), begins at 7PM.

The YOUNG FILMMAKERS COMPETITION (YFC) premieres at the New Buffalo Township Library on SATURDAY, MARCH 4 at 1PM. This year's competition features nearly two dozen short films by young visionaries from more than 10 states. An additional screening on March 8 at the Coastline Children's Film Festival (CCFF) storefront at 6pm is the last opportunity to vote for the Audience Favorite. Awards will be presented, red carpet style, on FRIDAY, MARCH 10 following the 6PM screening at The Oak Room at The Citadel.

Other events include a NIGHT HIKE & OWL PROWL at Sarett Nature Center, GATHER & KID FLICKS — with music by BRANDON J. WOODCOX at the Friends of New Troy Community Center, and an OPEN HOUSE at the CCFF storefront. We're thrilled to share the award-winning documentaries *Free Puppies, Scrap and Sunken Roads*. In addition, we're excited to announce an encore screening of the civil rights documentary — *MIGHTY TIMES: THE CHILDREN'S MARCH*. Last, but not least, DR. LARRY SCHANKER will provide improvisational piano accompaniment for two silent films — *The Blue Bird* (1918) and *I Was Born, But*. . . (1932) which close the festival when we return to The Acorn Theater on SUNDAY. MARCH 12.

In a last-minute dash across town, Alfons just barely manages to catch the bus for his class trip. A mix up with his luggage threatens to derail his efforts to impress his new classmate Leonie. In a desperate bid to impress her, Alfons comes up with the idea to run for class president. The fun continues as Alfons narrowly escapes his arch-nemesis's plots and avoids his teacher, Herr Flickendorf's, attempts to send him home. Flying macaroni with tomato sauce, exciting nights around the campfire, and a dangerous climbing tour turn the class trip into one that Alfons and his friends will never forget.

After Ferdinand, a bull with a big heart, is mistaken for a dangerous beast, he is captured and torn from his home. Determined to return to his family, he rallies a misfit team on the ultimate adventure. Ferdinand is an animated movie based on Munro Leaf's classic children's book about a bull who prefers flowers and friendship to aggression and fighting. The movie has strong messages of nonviolence, respect for Ferdinand's principles, and the friendships that can develop between creatures who are very different from each other.

Giovanni's Island IAPAN

2014 | 102 MINUTES | AGES 10+



From the studio behind Ghost in the Shell comes the award-winning historical drama Giovanni's Island, winner of the Satoshi Kon Award at the Fantasia Film Festival. Brothers Junpei and Kanta live on a tiny fishing island that has been spared from the devastation of World War II. The two children are named after Giovanni and Campanella from their late mother's favorite book, Night on the Galactic Railroad, which becomes a source of solace in the aftermath of Japan's defeat. When Soviet forces arrive with their families to settle on the island, Junpei meets Tanya, the daughter of the commander. Despite their language barrier and growing tension, the children soon form an unlikely friendship.

Free Puppies USA

2022 | 70 MINUTES | AGES 10+



Millions of rescue dogs from the rural South have been transported to new homes thanks to the tireless efforts of a grassroots network of dog rescuers. When Hurricane Katrina left more than 250,000 pets stranded, the infrastructure of modern pet transport for a nation-wide dog rescue effort was born. Since then, individual volunteers, transporters, shelters and rescue groups have created a movement to place millions of southern dogs in areas of the country with high demand for adoption but low supply. It is the true story of where those dogs came from and the challenges facing a group of intrepid women rescuers working together to save them.

MIGHTY TIMES: The Children's March USA

2004 | 41 MINUTES | AGES 12+



May 2, 1963, the young people of Birmingham, Alabama took to the streets to bring segregation to its knees. Their heroism in facing down fire hoses and police dogs for the sake of human rights complements discussions about the ability of today's young people to be catalysts for positive social change. The Unified Civic Monuments Project is an initiative to commemorate social justice and honor the historic legacies of Benton Harbor and St. Joseph, Michigan. The project will place a total of 4 monuments. Two monuments (one in each city) will represent civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Two others will honor a historic figure from each city.

SCRAP IISA

2022 | 78 MINUTES | AGES 10+



Discover the vast and strangely beautiful places where things go to die and meet the people who collect, restore, and recycle the world's scrap. This cinematic documentary tells the story of people who each have a deep connection to objects that have reached their 'end of life'. Together these stories convey a deeper environmental and human message about our relationship to things, the sadness we feel at their eventual loss, and the joy that we can find in giving them a new purpose. SCRAP scratches beneath flaking paint and rusting metal to reveal the beauty and pathos in the ugliness we leave behind. This film raises awareness about the fate of the things we use and explores how artists, and other creative thinkers, can be part of finding usefulness in the things we discard.

Sunken Roads: Three Generations after D-Day USA

2019 | 94 MINUTES | AGES 12+



Don McCarthy was 20 years old on D-Day, when his infantry division landed on Omaha Beach. Don and the other veterans who survived D-Day will someday soon have passed into memory and legend. This realization inspires 20-year-old filmmaker Charlotte Juergens to join Don and seven other D-day vets on a journey to France - a commemorative pilgrimage to Omaha Beach for the 70th anniversary of the invasion. The vets come to see Charlotte as a granddaughter, trusting her with their stories as they confront the trauma that still haunts them 70 years after the war. In capturing their lives, Charlotte's film offers a new, intergenerational perspective on D-Day, presenting the memories of 90-year-old combat veterans through the eyes of a 20-year-old woman.

This film excels in realizing the aspects of Maeterlinck's play with wide-eyed, guileless gusto: the spirits and fairies, the living souls of everyday objects like bread and milk, the Cathedral of Happiness, and more.

One of Ozu's most popular films, *I Was Born, But*... is a blithe portrait of the financial and psychological toils of one family, as told from the rascally point of view of a couple of stubborn little boys. For two brothers, the daily struggles of bullies and mean teachers is nothing next to the mortification they feel when they realize their good-natured father's low-rung social status. Reworked decades later as Ozu's Technicolor comedy *Good Morning*, it's a poignant evocation of the tumult of childhood, as well as a showcase for Ozu's expertly timed comedy editing.
