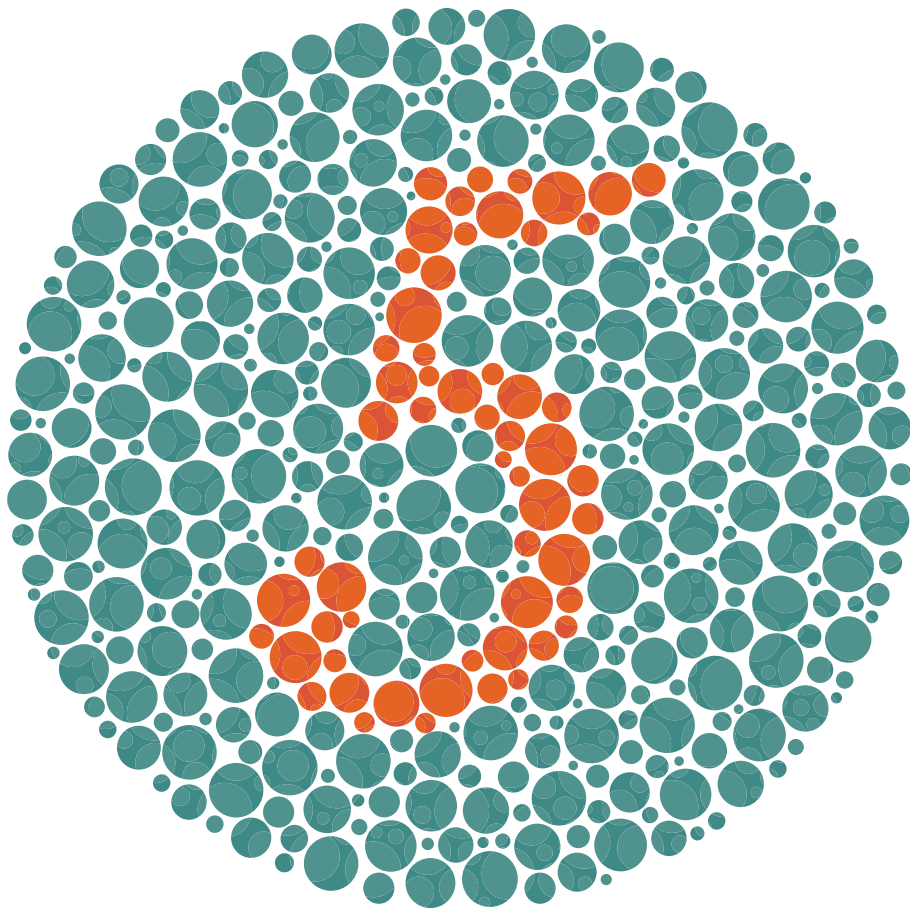

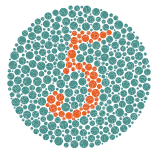


welcome to the coastline children's film festival

For many children, a weekend away from school means cartoons or decade-old Disney movies on television. *Coastline Children's Film Festival* wants to change that. Cinema has the power to inspire young minds and, for 10 days in March, we will provide nearly 50 sources of inspiration — all for free (\$1 suggested donation) — in collaboration with the *Krasl Art Center*. Some films are new and some are not-so-new. In fact, a few of them are really old! Many have enjoyed world-wide acclaim while others continue to lavish in obscurity. There are award winners and audience favorites. *Full-length features. Documentaries. Silent classics. Shorts.* All chosen just for you!


The festival kicks off on *March 13th* with an *Opening Night Pajama Party* hosted by the *Krasl Art Center*. The evening begins at 6:00pm with music by the multit talented *Morgan Ingle* and continues at 7:00pm with *Kid Flix Mix*—a selection of short films from the New York International Children's Film Festival (NYICFF). The *Young Filmmakers Competition* program will premiere at the *New Buffalo Township Public Library* at 2:00pm on *March 14th*. Now in its third year, the competition features 16 short films directed by local young visionaries. Awards will be presented, red carpet style, at the *Citadel Oak Room* at 7:00pm on *March 20th*—immediately following the 5:30 pm screening. Other events include a *Lego stop-motion animation workshop*, a *panel discussion on documentary filmmaking* and a very special *tea party*. Events are free and open to the public. See the next page for date, time, location and any registration requirements.

Finally (saving the best for last) the inimitable *Dr. Larry Schanker* will, once again, provide improvisational piano accompaniment to not one, but three silent films: *The Gold Rush (1925)*, *Alice In Wonderland (1915)* and *The General (1927)*—which will close the festival at the *Krasl Art Center* on *March 22nd*.



This year's theme was inspired by **The Tests For Colour Blindness** published by Japanese ophthalmologist, Shinobu Ishihara in 1918. Initially created as a way to screen military recruits for abnormalities of color vision, Ishihara's test continues to be the one of choice throughout the world today. This stylized version of the orange #5 nested in a field of aquamarine dots can be perceived by all sighted individuals.

In an effort to be more globally responsible, this year's booklet is markedly smaller. Fewer pages means fewer sheets of paper are needed for printing. This reduces our dependence on trees *and* produces a booklet that is 20% lighter than last year (25% lighter than 2013). A lighter booklet cuts the amount of fossil fuel needed for shipping—thus lowering our carbon footprint.

No stones in slingshots. No skirmishes too late in the day. If you spit-shake on something, you better follow through. These are rules of war for the youngsters of two neighboring Irish villages – rival gangs who engage in battles that always end with the removal of buttons from the captured losers' clothing. This classic film examines issues of war, its actions and consequences and how it can divide people that can be friends just as easily as they can be enemies.

Meet Sili Lam, a headstrong twelve year old paraplegic who becomes the first girl to sell a daily newspaper on the street – a job that is not so easy. After accusing a policeman of shaking her down, Sili takes on the boys who steal her newspapers and crutches. When a friend asks her, "What next?", Sili triumphantly responds, "We continue." Scenes are expertly played by non-professional actors to a score by acclaimed musician Wasis Diop – who just so happens to be the film director's brother! *French and Wolof with English subtitles.*

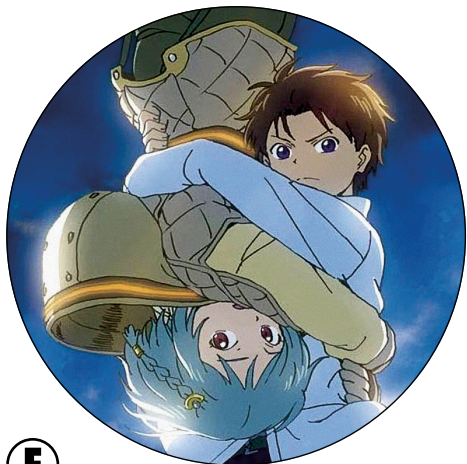
the glitterball

When a group of small, round aliens accidentally abandons one of their own on Earth, adventurous kids Max and Pete stumble upon the "Glitterball" and attempt to return it to its mother ship. As the boys learn more about the friendly alien and its magical powers, they must protect it from an army corporal and a small-time thief who are hunting the extraterrestrial for their own cruel purposes. Referred to as the precursor to Stephen Spielberg's, E.T. The Extra-Terrestrial (U.S./1982) — minus the emotional element.

A perspective-twisting sci-fi adventure about two kids separated by opposite gravities. Patema is a princess from the underground who, after ignoring the rules of her clan, tumbles into a void and up into a world of reverse physics. Age, a student, spies Patema hanging upside-down from a tree and pulls her down to safety. If she lets go, she will 'fall up' into the sky and be lost forever. While navigating their competing gravitational forces, Patema and Age set out to discover the secret that keeps their worlds apart. *English language version.*

Gillie (Haley Mills' film debut) is a rough-and-tumble street urchin who witnesses the brutal killing of a young woman at the hands of visiting Polish sailor Korchinsky. Instead of reporting the crime to the authorities, Gillie pockets Korchinsky's shiny black revolver and flees the scene. When Welsh Detective Graham (played by Haley's father, John Mills) discovers that Gillie has the murder weapon, the fiery young girl weaves a web of lies to throw him off course. *Brief violence, mild profanity, smoking and drinking.*

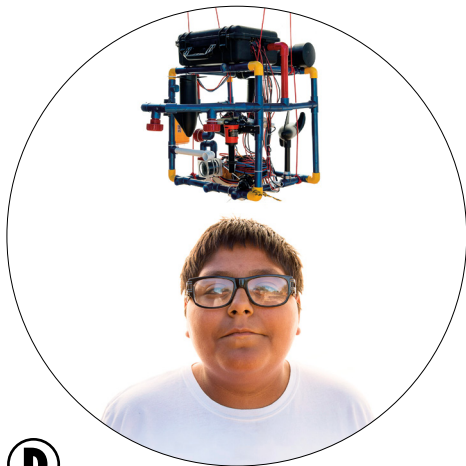
Live Action Documentary • David Hoffman • 1982 • 51 minutes • Ages 9+

Jumping rope is one of the most timeless and universal forms of play. It can be found in nearly every era and on every continent. And yet, no one knows for sure where it came from. In 'double Dutch', two ropes are spun simultaneously in opposite directions. This film follows Black Magic, one of the greatest 'double Dutch' teams of all time. Go behind the scenes to see them practice and follow their tour of England. It is an emotional story about some very unusual girls—charming, funny, touching and beautiful.

In a stadium in Kabul where women were once stoned, girls are learning to box. They come here to train and to prove that they are free and modern women. At the same time, they are literally fighting for respect for themselves and for their nation. Coach Sabir Sharifi is doing what he can to prepare *his* girls for the 2012 Olympic Games. Is Afghanistan ready to show the world that it can produce top-level female boxers? The moment of truth arrives when the girls step into the ring to fight for the first time. *Persian with English subtitles.*

Born on a boat and raised in shipyards, Laura Dekker grew up with one dream: to sail around the world alone. At thirteen, her daring plot sparked resistance from Dutch authorities and a global storm of media scrutiny. A year later, she won the right to set sail. Now, far from land, family and unwanted attention, Laura spends her pivotal teenage years exploring the world alone in search of freedom, adventure, and lost childhood dreams. A blend of filmmaking, voice recordings and intimate vérité footage. *Cursing like a sailor.*

The Okee Dokee Brothers are a Grammy-winning, American bluegrass and children's music duo from Minneapolis. In May of 2013, they embarked on a month-long trek along the Appalachian Trail (2168 miles stretching from Spring Mountain in Georgia to Mount Katahdin in Maine). Their mission – to experience the mountain wilderness while learning about the musical traditions of the region. These childhood friends hiked, camped, met mountain musicians and wrote songs for their Grammy-nominated and Parents' Choice Award-winning album of the same name.

the gold rush (charles chaplin)

Silent Film • Charles Chaplin • 1925 • 95 minutes • Ages 6+

Charlie Chaplin's comedic masterwork—which charts a prospector's search for fortune in the Klondike and his discovery of romance (with the beautiful Georgia Hale)—forever cemented the iconic status of Chaplin and his Little Tramp character. Shot partly on location in the Sierra Nevadas (earlier location scenes were scrapped and reshot on a backlot set) and featuring such timeless gags as the dance of the dinner rolls and the meal of boiled shoe leather. *The Gold Rush* is an indelible work of heartwarming hilarity.

alice in wonderland

Silent Film • W.W. Young • 1915 • 52 minutes • Ages 6+

While at a picnic with her sister, Alice becomes bored, falls asleep and enters a wonderland inhabited by talking animals and walking playing cards. This is the first American film adaptation of the Lewis Carroll classic starring Viola Savoy and Elmo Lincoln (who went on to become the original Tarzan). Produced long before computer generated imagery (CGI), the creatures are actors dressed in elaborate costumes and sculpted heads. The absence of sound creates a surreal, dreamlike quality.

The International Youth Silent Film Festival was founded in 2009 by organic pear farmer Jon “JP” Palanuk after he attending a live theatre organ concert. So inspired by what he heard, he decided to “create a competition where young filmmakers can create their own silent movies.” Silent films are the most classic form of movie entertainment and the easiest to create using modern technology - no sound editing, no problem. Past judges have included Gus Van Sant, Tom DeSanto and Chuck Palahniuk. *Subtitled, Winning films from the 2015 Young Filmmakers Competition will screen at the end of the program.*

the general (buster keaton) USA

Silent Film • Clyde Bruckman & Buster Keaton • 1927 • 78 minutes • Ages 6+

Orson Welles called *The General*, “The greatest comedy ever made, the greatest Civil War film ever made, and perhaps the greatest film ever made.” Roger Ebert described it as an epic of silent comedy, one of the most expensive films of its time, including an accurate historical recreation of a Civil War episode, hundreds of extras, dangerous stunt sequences and an actual locomotive falling from a burning bridge into a gorge far below. Keaton’s movies showcase a graceful perfection, such a meshing of story, character and episode, that they unfold like music. *Improvisational piano accompaniment by Dr. Larry Schanker.*

No, this is not a film. It’s gratitude. Gratitude so big that it would never fit into the tiny confines of the *credits* section. It’s the delight, humility and respect we feel for the time, talent and support that our friend, Dr. Larry Schanker, has so generously brought to the film festival. Larry has been writing music for theatre, film, dance and the concert hall for nearly 30 years. In 2013, festival-goers were treated to his artistry, first-hand, when he (along with Megan Barrett on harp) performed his original score to the 1924 silent film version of J.M. Barrie’s *Peter Pan*. What Larry brings to our silent film program cannot be put into words. It must be experienced. His piano playing is so perfectly tuned to what’s happening on the screen that you completely surrender yourself to the moment and forget that the music is live. From all of us—BRAVO!
